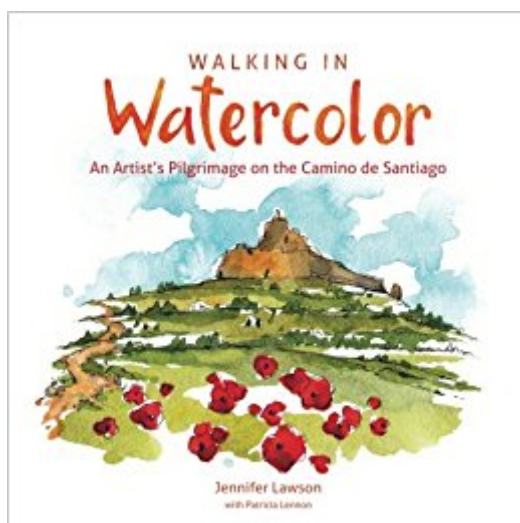

Jennifer Lawson, Author, Illustrator Finding her way into commercial art after college, Jennifer spent twenty years as vice president of creative design for LL Bean in Freeport, Maine. In her post-corporate career, she has worked for more than ten years as a freelance creative director, designer, and illustrator. In between freelance jobs, Jennifer picked up a pen and started to draw. It changed her life and how she sees the world. She has sketched and painted her way up and down the Maine coast and throughout the United States. She has sketched through Paris, Barcelona, Lisbon, over the Inca Trail to the ruins of Machu Picchu, while living on the island of Bali, Indonesia, climbing to the top of Mt Kilimanjaro, and most recently while walking on the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage across Spain. Through her 500-mile journey as a walker/sketcher/pilgrim, she discovered her true artist self. As she traveled across northern Spain to Santiago de Compostela, she always found a place to sketch at the end of each amazing day. Jennifer is rarely seen without a pen and

sketchbook. She finds the inspiration to draw from even the simplest of surroundings.

This book tells the story of an energetic, delightful adventure taking by two women whom I have had the pleasure of knowing for the past thirty years. It is colorful, entertaining, creative and inspirational. The dedication and persistence to completing both the journey and the book, deserve big applause! Jennifer and Patricia deserve credit for an amazing tale accompanied by lively, vivid illustrations which portray the sights, personalities and challenges of their adventure. Bravo!!!!

Delightful book! Beautifully illustrated catalog of two friends' hiking adventure on Spain's famed Camino de Santiago de Compostela, The Way. Artist Jennifer Lawson captures the small delights along this 500-mile journey, with her elegant, lively watercolor-over-ink depictions of landscapes, street scenes, fellow pilgrims, contented locals, gardens and animals. Detailed renderings of elegant churches are mixed with charming sketches of flowers, tapas, sheep and laundry on the line. The narrative of Jennifer and Patricia's experiences is a good read. The day by day account describes the physical hardships with a light touch and provides wonderful details of the beauty they encounter along The Way. Bonus at the end: complete list of sketch kit, palette, gear, hiking hair treatments and essentials for hiking. Recommend it to watercolor enthusiasts, avid hikers, and armchair travelers.

If you only buy one Camino book this year, this is the one. I walked the Camino in May and June of 2016 and, as I read this book, I was right back on the trail in my mind. The paintings are so vivid and the prose is so descriptive that, you can almost feel your boots crunching on the stones beneath your feet. If you've already walked the Camino, this book will bring you back again. If you haven't yet walked this magical trail, then Walking In Watercolor will be the impetus to get you going. Over the years I have purchased at least sixty books written by people that have walked the Camino and this is at the top of the list. Get a copy of this book and I'm certain it will be at the top of your list too.
