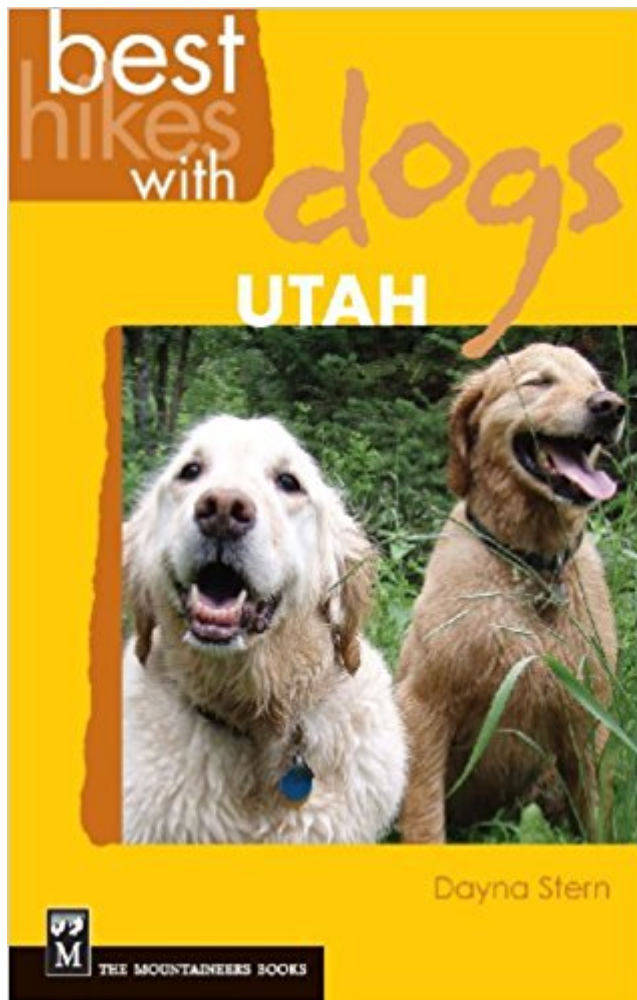

I love this book! Like others I was bored of the same hikes I was doing with my dogs (I live in salt lake) and needed to find some new places. There are so many more hikes I didn't know even existed that are so close to me, and I use the book as a guide to decide where to go camping/hiking based on where my dogs can join us too. I have found the author has a lot of great details about hikes that you can't always find easily on the internet, but sometimes I do double check online if dogs require leashes or not. I have even learned a little more about hikes that I have frequented often from the book.

I was always doing the same old hikes with my dogs and getting a bit bored. This book provides a whole new spectrum of options. It describes what to expect from the hike including the difficulty level, the views, the terrain and most importantly for me, easy directions on where to find the trails. I also appreciate the splash of humor throughout the book which makes it a fun easy read. My dogs love hikes that include water holes and I can easily locate those in this book. I've since bought more books to give to my canine loving friends.

Some good hike suggestions, but really bad idea of little horse and bell slot canyon hike!!! There were several 7' drops or lift ups....really difficult w a large dog. Advice: if going up little horse, turn around and go back at chest deep water hole. U will have seen the best slots by then. Or go up bell and turn around at 7+ feet lift up. Then route is not as scenic.

I got this book for its info on hikes in central Utah (San Rafael Swell area). The two hikes we did from this book gave us were amazing: the true slot canyon experience! Double check the trailhead info before you go: The author gives accurate info, but because of the remote location of the Maidenwater Canyon hike, the trailhead was unmarked and difficult to find. (No clue how she knew it was there, but I'm grateful she included it!) This book was worth every penny I spent on it, and my dog and I are already planning another trip using this book as a resource!

We are planning a road trip to Utah in May with 2 dogs. This book helped us plan several hikes along the way. Very detailed description given for each hike.

I haven't had a total chance to study it and make any hikes yet. But as I read through it, it is divided into areas, nice descriptions and easy to follow. I am glad I bought it so I can explore Utah with my dog a whole lot more!

This is the BEST hiking book! The author has really done her accurate research & only wish the pics were in color. A good book to keep as a hiking bible.
