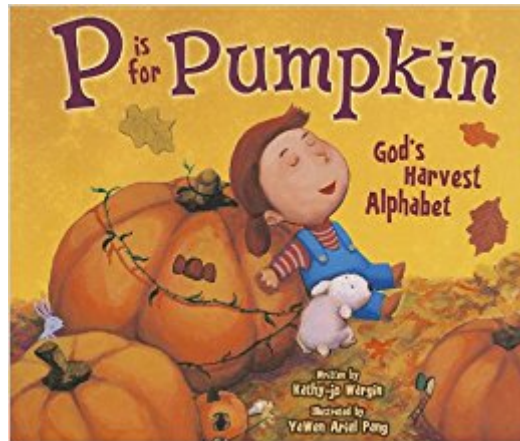

I love this book. I read it every fall with my students. They always come up with more fall things for

each letter of the alphabet. The story celebrates autumn and the fall harvest from A to Z. I bought a copy for our family to have other stories about fall. Kathy-Jo Wargin is a great author. This story is in a rhyming format. Great for reading aloud. Some of her other works include "Legend of Sleeping Bear" and "Edmund Fitzgerald: Song of the Bell". Her stories frequently take place in states around the Great Lakes. Her writing touches the reader's heart. Beautifully illustrated by YaWen Ariel Pang. Secularists may get their feathers ruffled by the mention of "God" in the book, but for those families and schools who want to celebrate autumn without the focus on just Halloween, this is a great addition to their collection. Our public libraries also have the book.
