

I really enjoyed this read on holiday recently. The Saturday evening visitation of certain Dublin hostelleries has a real Joycean eye for detail. It brought back many memories of my work and social life during the early 90s in Dublin. Well done Danny.

The first half of the book is more of a sales and marketing how to then a story and a good one if I had been looking for a book in sales. By the time it got to the story line I just didn't care anymore but after investing enough time to read half a book I read a little more with hope that I would find a story somewhere in there. I gave up before finishing the book, Mr. Doyle does have talent and I appreciated his writing ability. If he didn't I would never have gotten past the first half.

The difficulties of settling back in Dublin have being well documented in the past, the author brings humour and light to a potential life changing triumph or disaster. A very entertaining read.

"London Irish Dublin English" by Daniel M Doyle is the story of a Londoner named Donal, who moves to Ireland in the 1980's and tries to fit in friends and work colleagues. The characters come alive on the pages and you feel like you are a fly on the wall watching everything unfold. The story makes you laugh and cry and laugh again. For a short story it did drag at times but well worth the read. The joys and sorrows of an emigrant trying to fit in are amply and honestly covered. Even those who are not of Irish descent can identify with the people in the stories and will enjoy the book.

A great read if you are familiar with the vast similarities and differences between Irish and English people. You will be taken on a very interesting journey across Dublin with the leading character as he navigates traditional social networks of early hours of the morning type. The book is very well

written as the characters drift in and out of the story lines with ease and intertwine beautifully. You may even sympathise with the leading character as he has moments where the end of the working day does not enable him to switch off.

Without repeating what others have written, it documents his first year - cash strapped and wondering if he's done the right thing. He was a salesman transferred from the London office of a big corporation and has to deal with the culture shock. If anyone had told me that someone could write an interesting and even amusing story about a sales and tendering process I would have accused them of early dementia. D M Doyle has managed it with aplomb.

A wry, humorous tale, told with a style that belies the relative inexperience of the author. I was very impressed. Well done!
