

I know I was way to sheltered and uninformed. I feel fortunate I made it to retirement age in tact (mostly).

I read this to learn more about the exploration and adventurers in the South Pacific which I enjoyed, but this isn't James Michener's writing so must be his co-author, A.Grove Day who is not nearly as effective-entertaining. Nonetheless I did learn and stimulate my interest in knowing more and visiting the islands.

I read this book back in the 70's but lost it. I ordered it for a friend.. reread it again, and gave it to him. He was also happy to receive and read it as Michener (as usual) has written a well crafted book using excellent research. If one is interested in sailing, the sea, and the true stories of pirates and scoundrels of years past; I would encourage you to read this book.

Michener's writing could always make watching grass grow an adventure, so it's no surprise that these pirates and con men make for interesting reading. The characters' fascination with religion, war and conquest seems dated until I look at current headlines, and realize some things never change.

I thoroughly enjoyed the book. I'm a huge fan of Michener! Well written and lots of different stories in here.

Some of the stories I really enjoyed others not so much. The good ones were really good though.

I've read a lot of Michener's books. This is neither one of the best or one of the worst. But it does tend to do well from a human interest point of view and does give some good insights about life in the south pacific.

Some stories were more interesting than other. For example, I like the story of Captain Bligh better than the last story about the artist.
