

Keeping with the hallmark of the text, Riasanovsky and Steinberg examine all aspects of Russia's history--political, international, military, economic, social, and cultural--with a commitment to objectivity, fairness, and balance, and to reflecting recent research and new trends in scholarly interpretation. New chapters on politics, society, and culture since 1991 explore Russia's complex experience after communism and discuss its chances of becoming a more stable and prosperous country in the future. Widely acclaimed as the best one-volume history available, *A History of Russia* is also available in two split volumes--the first covers early Russia through the nineteenth century and the second ranges from 1855 to the present. Volume II features an additional introductory chapter that links Russia's modern history to the events that preceded it.

Nicholas Riasanovsky is Professor Emeritus of History the University of California, Berkeley. He is the author of several books, including *A Parting of Ways: Government and the Educated Public in Russia: 1801-1855* (1976) and *The Image of Peter the Great in Russian History and Thought* (OUP, 1985). Mark Steinberg is Professor of History at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Specializing in the cultural, intellectual, and social history of Russia in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, his many books include *Voices of Revolution, 1917* (2001) and *Proletarian Imagination: Self, Modernity, and the Sacred in Russia, 1910-1925* (2002). Since 2006, he has been editor of the journal *Slavic Review*.

Riasanovsky was one of the greatest master minds when it came to Russian/Soviet history and politics. This book primary focus on medieval/imperial Russia from the beginning taking a lot of it's content from the Russian Chronicles. Despite the books being pretty heavy, the chapters are short and to the point. It's a good book to have on your personal library shelf if you're into Russian history or need extra content for any Russia history course. This book will come in handy as an excellent resource.

From time to time, Riasanovsky might seem a little dry to the casual reader, but this is an excellent rendering of Russian history from the beginning to age of Gorbechov; not only are events recorded, Riasanovsky also records changes in art, economics, and patterns of social thought; he is thorough without overloading the reader and profound in analysis.
