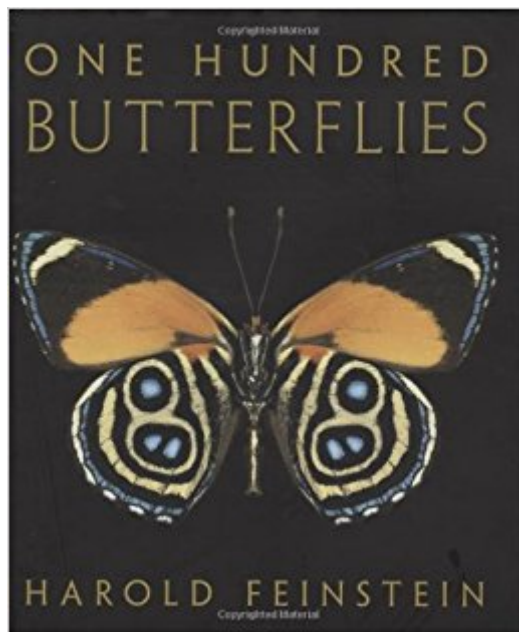

Harold Feinstein's distinguished career in photography began in 1950, when Edward Steichen purchased his work for the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art and exhibited it frequently during his tenure there. Feinstein's photographs have also been exhibited by and represented in the collections of the International Center of Photography, the George Eastman House, the Museum of the City of New York, and the Musée d'Art Moderne in Paris. His work has appeared in such periodicals as *Life*, *Audubon*, *Connoisseur*, and *Popular Photography*. He is the author of *100 Flowers*, *Foliage*, *The Infinite Rose*, and *The Infinite Tulip*. Feinstein lives in Merrimac, Massachusetts. Fred Gagnon is curator of butterflies at Magic Wings Butterfly Conservatory and Gardens in South Deerfield, Massachusetts, where he tends over three thousand butterflies from Asia, Australia, Africa, South America, and North America.

When my children were little and we lived in Brooklyn I used to take them every year to the butterfly garden exhibit at the Zoo. It was amazing to see so many varieties of butterflies up close, and this experience had such an effect on me that I began collecting a few special pieces of butterfly art to display in my home as a remembrance. I came across this book of photographs which not only speaks to my love of butterflies but of my recently renewed interest in photography. I'll agree with another review that this is not super-macro photography that would show every hair on the butterfly's leg but the photos are large, lush, clear and colorful. The generous size of the book makes it destined to have a home on any coffee table. Even better if you have room to leave it open to reveal some of the beautiful images inside. Very pleased with this purchase and recommended.
