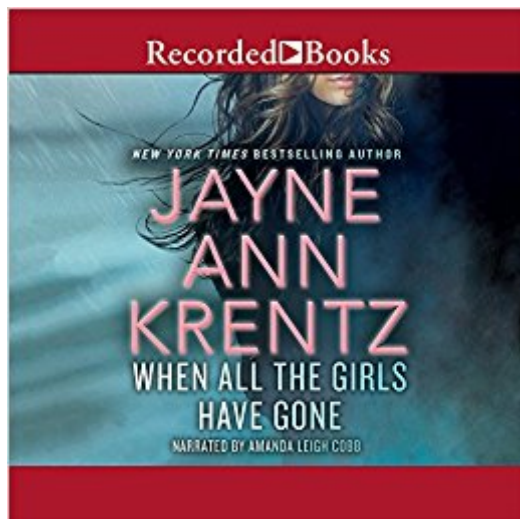


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When All The Girls Have Gone

contemporary romantic suspense novels under that name, as well as futuristic and historical romance novels under the pseudonyms Jayne Castle and Amanda Quick, respectively. There are more than 35 million copies of her books in print.

Okay, this book is definitely a romantic suspense . . . or maybe, a suspenseful romance? Either way, there is plenty of both in it. One of the things I really liked about Max and Charlotte is they are ordinary people. Neither one is *stunningly* attractive. They both have to work to pay the bills. And they both have broken relationships in their past. They have problems, just like everybody else. Max is definitely the strong, in charge type, but he doesn't try to tell Charlotte what to do. Probably because he realizes it would be a waste of time. They both consider themselves plodders and use the phrase *"one foot in front of the other"* to describe themselves. They are just likable people. Now, the mystery. All I can say is Good Grief! I had it figured out half way through the book. I thought. Nope. I was totally wrong. Then, I decided it was someone else. How could I have missed that? Nope, that wasn't it. And the plot continued to twist and turn. When the mystery is finally solved and all the questions are answered, I had an *"oh, yeah"* moment. There was nothing that came out of left field. I felt like I should have seen it all along. And that makes for a great mystery. It kept me guessing, but all the clues were there. Jayne Ann Krentz is a great romance author. I have been reading her books for years. However, she is also a wonderful suspense writer. I read her books for the romance and humor, but the plots completely grab me. I haven't seen anything that says there will be any sequels, but Max is one of three brothers. I really think (hope) we are going to get a trilogy at least. When *All the Girls Have Gone* comes out November 29th. Give yourself an early Christmas present, but make sure you have time to read it. JAK novels. I want to see if they can solve the old case that got all 3 men into investigative-type careers. Please do this, Jayne, for one of your devoted fans! If you like adventure, thought-provoking conversations, some humor, great characters who are not perfect and a great romance, then this book, or any other book by JAK for contemporary romances, Amanda Quick for historical romances, or Jayne Castle for otherworldly romances will please you. This book almost rated a five star review, but for a somewhat slow beginning. I had a harder time than usual getting into it. Possibly because there were several characters in the beginning, and it took time to figure out who's who. What's what comes along much later, and is very well done. Charlotte's half sister, Jocelyn has disappeared, and not just to the techless retreat she is supposed to be a guest at. That something has happened to her is obvious, but is she hiding, or has her past finally caught up with her? Determined to find her, and keep her safe, Charlotte enlists the help of a P.I., Max, who is working for a client whose cousin has been found dead of an apparent drug overdose. The cousin believes his cousin, Louise, has been murdered. Charlotte is convinced he's right. Louise is Jocelyn's best friend, as well as a member of a small, very exclusive investment group who are about to do very well on one of their investments. Without giving away any spoilers, I will just say there were many tangled threads in this romantic suspense story. As usual, Ms. Krentz handled them all deftly, knitting them together beautifully so they made a wonderful finished product; a terrific story! Her main characters; Charlotte, and Max are both likable, and believable. I cared about them, and wanted them to have their happy ending. The book is apparently the first of a trilogy. I'm so looking forward to reading the stories of Max's two brothers!

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
