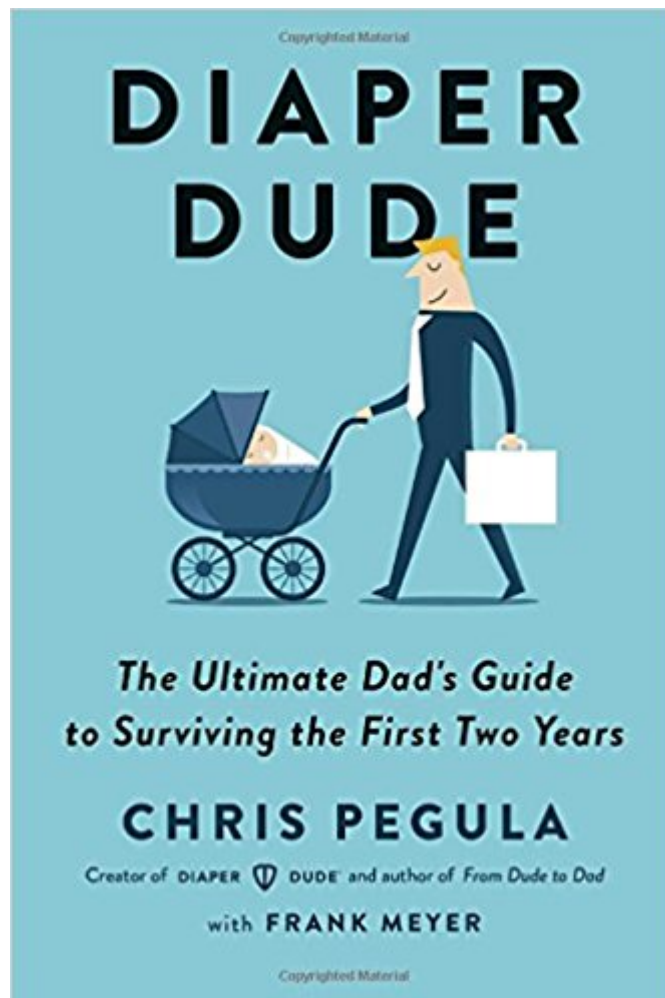

Informative and funny! A must read for all dads!

The book does a decent job of covering all aspects of raising a baby for the first few years, with a peek into information for the following years. The problem is this information is coming from one person's limited knowledge and experience, with no facts or research to back it up. This makes it a good book for little tips like the "parenting hacks" scattered through the book, but terrible for advice on important things like circumcision and parenting styles. The book's opinion on circumcision

highlights this problem: (paraphrasing from the book) the author opted for his son to get a circumcision solely so they didn't "look different from him", and admits that his opinion might have changed after doing more research. Including the actual pros and cons for issues such as these would provide the reader the ability to make their own informed decision, rather than hearing the snap decision of the author. The other main problem with the book is the fact that it is very disorganized. There are small tip sections scattered throughout the book, but in no coherent order. This makes it feel disjointed, for example, to read a tip on preventing your baby from rolling out of bed when reading about different parenting styles. Lastly, it feels as though the author wrote the book merely to try to push his own company's product, instead of to provide the reader with helpful information. In practically every chapter, his company is shoehorned in. This makes sense when listing some helpful brands to keep an eye out for when researching baby products, but feels more like a commercial when discussing it when talking about returning to work after the baby is born. Overall, this book is a good introduction to scratching the surface of what you will go through during your child's first few years. But this can't be the only book you read as the only information is empirical and not fully thought out.

Your wife will read all the books about what to expect during pregnancy and after, none of them will give you the knowledge and parables as a dude that this tome contains. Insightful humor peppers dad-experiences as Diaper Dude Chris Pegula breaks down the true nature of fatherhood. If you read one book as a new dad, make sure this is it!
