

In this Instaread summary (think DETAILED review) of the book One of Us you will read about the 2011 Norway Massacre involving 32 year old Anders Breivik which left 77 dead and 319 injured. The 545 page original is described by some as "a little slow" so this 33 page summary is a great alternative if you just want to get the main ideas or maybe refresh your memory after reading the original. There are 8 Key Takeaways presented in this Instaread summary. Here are a couple to whet your appetite:>>>#3 - "Breivik came to see himself as a right-wing Christian crusader defending Norway and Europe from Muslims, feminists, and the multiculturalism promoted by "Cultural Marxists," a term Breivik used for leftists.">>>#4 - "Breivik's preparations for the attack were lengthy, detailed, and careful. His activities were legal, avoided the detection of law enforcement, and complicated the insanity defense offered by his legal counsel at his subsequent trial."The author of

the original book, Asne Seiestad, a Norwegian journalist, relied on court documents and interviews as her primary sources. HOWEVER the original is not just about Anders but also includes information on some of the youth activists killed/shot during the attack. How did Anders' early life experiences impact his more mature life? Where did Freemasonry and online gaming guilds come in? This is a VERY interesting summary to read, I, for one, would not want to troll through the original 545 pages but really enjoyed catching a glimpse of what happened on that fateful day and before. On July 22nd, 2011, Anders Breivik killed eight people by setting off a van bomb in Oslo, and then murdered 69 participants of a Worker's Youth League summer camp on the island of Otoya. He was later convicted of mass murder and terrorism. His story is captured in the journalistic account "One of Us," by Asne Seirstad. As a right-wing terrorist, Breivik was consumed with xenophobia and Islamophobia. His violent acts stemmed from his twisted ideology and his troubled childhood and adolescence. A great deal of the book also profiles the teenage victims in the attack, and the author relies on court documents and interviews as her primary sources. This review by Instaread sparked my interest in an international tragedy that I was unaware of before today. This review breaks down the story into 8 key takeaways that are easily digested and perfect for students needing to skim a dense book. I was given a copy of this book to review.

I received a free copy of this book in exchange for an honest review. This is a summary and analysis of "One of Us" and is not the original book. It is divided into eight key takeaways that highlight the main ideas of the book. Readers will also find a list of important people and information on the author's style and perspective. The book discusses Breivik's childhood, his political views, his preparations for the attack, and his trial.
