


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More Than Jamie Baker (Jamie Baker Trilogy Book 2)

It is quickly learned after Jamie was attacked that he also has super powers. Teddy is crazy (I mean crazy) in love with Jamie and he takes things to a whole new level. Teddy ends up playing a big part in this book. Ryan constantly stays by Jamie's side and helps her out in any way that he can. He even gets shot while trying to protect her. Jamie quickly learns she is being followed by the very people she didn't want to

learn about her powers. She is not afraid for her and her friends and is eventually forced into hiding. She's not so much a superhero because she doesn't plan to go after bad guys, that's what the police are for. She wants to rescue people. That's what she does. She is smitten with Ryan. Their relationship is fantastic. Then she meets Teodoro and he is set on making Jamie his. Around the time she meets Teodoro, she notices she's being followed. She tries to learn more about the people following her so she asks, Carter, a reporter, to do some research for her. The small amounts of information she is able to gather keeps her on her toes. She's still only a human that makes mistakes. This book is packed with action and the ending is quite surprising. This book is in Jamie's POV with great editing.

I'm just gonna go ahead and warn you now, this review may contain spoilers, cause I'm pretty pissed about Mike and Becky's side story here. This book was sloooooow in the beginning. I didn't and don't like Teddy and I'm kinda irritated that this book wasn't as good as I thought it would be. You see KO, when you keep writing great stuff, my expectations just keep going up, up, up. But this one may have missed the mark just a bit. It was a good read, but it took too long to get to the meat of the story in my opinion. The rape recovery side story was going great. Until it wasn't. As a victim of sexual assault, I can totally understand Becky's feelings of betrayal from Jamie. It wasn't Jamie's place to forgive him nor was it her place to try and convince Becky he was sorry. It isn't about being sorry at this point, it's about being a good support system for your friend. And if Jamie was a victim like she said she was, then she should have known that. You can't force people to forgive others. That's not how it works. I may be a bit jaded because of my past but it is what it is. Just cause he gets hurt doesn't mean he deserves to be forgiven. In fact, some would call that Karma. I don't feel bad for him in the least. He made his bed, he didn't lie in it though. Then he blamed his actions on alcohol. What about after you sobered up huh? Did he take responsibility then? Uh, no, he didn't, then he sabotaged his own life because he's an idiot. And Ryan! ::shakes head:: Ryan is blissfully

ignorant of the fact his best friend is a rapist! Oh dear god, someone tell me this doesn't reoccur in the next book. I might have to DNF it if that's the case.
