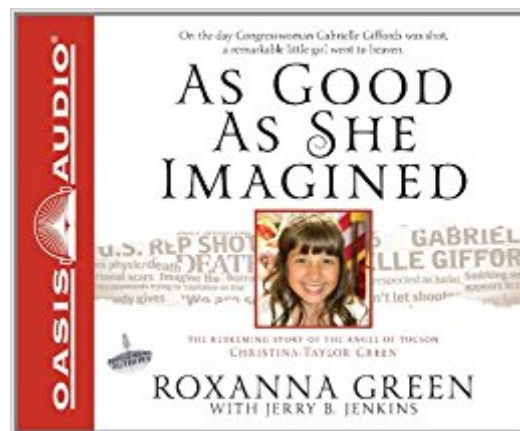




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As Good As She Imagined (Library Edition): The Redeeming Story Of The Angel Of Tucson, Christina-Taylor Green

Although referring to his daughter, there is no greater reflection of these ideals than in this family's vision and commitment to make Christina-Taylor's dreams a reality. As parents, we often ask, "What should we teach our children?" Those more courageous ask: What can we learn from our children that should be nourished to make the world a better place? What I love about this story is that the endpoint IS the journey - accomplished not in words, but through countless steps of truth and action, from which we may derive meaning and spiritual renewal. Through narration and a mix of design elements, Roxanna Green conveys a family history of deeply held values that shaped her upbringing, later providing vision and direction for her family's growth. A montage of spirit and heart make this book special and memorable. The story isn't told in words alone. The format itself, akin to an heirloom

quilt, is a metaphor of imagination, linking family photos, inspirational prose, and personal insights through the generations. There is a cohesive quality to this book that is hard to explain. Suffice it to say it's a thing of beauty inside and out. Integrity plus. What makes this book so powerful is that it shows you, but doesn't tell you explicitly, the context for this legacy of goodness - and that is the magic. There is not an ounce of preachiness. If goodness is to be inspired from within, it involves a creative, intuitive process from which each of us finds our own roadmap. There is power in what is not said. I recall my mother telling me that when her 9-year old brother died unexpectedly, my grandparents' grief was so overwhelming, they couldn't talk about it. However, my mother remembered that for many years later, my grandmother would practice a daily ritual of preparing a beautiful full-course meal, which she would carefully wrap, box, and deliver every day before dawn, anonymously, to the doorstep of a neighbor, whom she hardly knew - and who had also lost a child. The legacy of my grandmother's heart of gold touched many people and allowed her to live a life of meaning. The clarity of her simple truth shaped our lives and healed many broken hearts over the years, including her own. This book is a treasure to be pursued and implemented in its message. A blessing to the bereaved, this is a deeply inspirational work for people of all faiths. Anyone who has experienced loss, or facing catastrophic illness or other hardship would find a gift of immeasurable quality in these pages. Friends and family who seek ways of supporting loved ones would do well to glean the pearls of wisdom - a rich source of insight for those in the helping professions - teachers, clergy, healthcare providers, counselors, etc., who want to gain a more meaningful understanding of loss and sorrow. As Viktor Frankel said, "The meaning of your life is to help others find theirs." "As Good As She Imagined" is a sublime example.
