

As for my daughter she has been really obsessed with fossils as she is learning about them in school. She loved learning about the fossil record. This book was an e-book downloaded to read on the kindle app. It was very interesting with lots of real photographs of the various amphibians. It is listed at a first grade level, and worked well with our first grade students. They were very interested in the different facts, behaviors, and information about amphibians. They loved seeing the brightly colored amphibians, especially the frogs. They also loved learning facts like that the animals are covered in mucus and will eat anything they can swallow whole.I do wish this book was a little longer, which is part of why I only gave 4 stars. It has a double page spread with a picture and information about amphibians, then the next page is just a picture. With only 18 pages, it did not cover as much material as I expected. The other reason I gave it 4 stars is that there are no identifying labels for the amphibians. On each page, the kids wanted to know what type of frog it was or the type of amphibian. I am not an expert as to which frog is which, and it would have been nice to have a label on the page to tell us that this is a "common tree frog" or a "poison dart frog" so that we could do more research about each type without having to google based on a description of the picture.I received this e-book download free for my kindle app in exchange for an honest and unbiased review.

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
