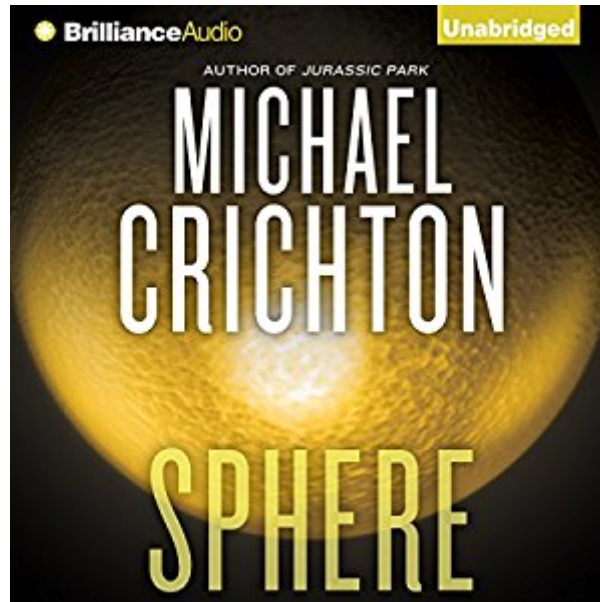

I enjoy a good sci-fi mixed with strange twists and great character development so I will definitely be finding another Michael Crichton novel soon.

Michael Crichton has written many fantastic, can't put them down stories that are full of suspense and focus. This novel starts out as most of his great books do, by pulling you into the drama excited by what's coming next. But by the end the story, it loses the creativity that kept you absorbed, and fails to keep you interested by resorting to simple conclusion's. I enjoyed the story but was disappointed with the ending.

Without spoiling the details, I would say that this book has a very interesting premise that it utterly fails to capitalize on. From a technical standpoint, the writing is fine, the characters are well established, etc, but there's no satisfaction to be had from the events of the last third of the book.

Without revealing too much of the plot, this book was about a sphere of possibly alien origin that was discovered underwater, and how it affected a crew of scientists sent to investigate a crashed aircraft of some sort. It was quick-paced and well thought out. Even the technology was still advanced for this day and age. Definitely worth the read. Crichton seems to have done his research into psychology and how a psychologist would react in such a situation. It was also an interesting look into how the navy might have run at least in the 1980s.
