

Snorri Sturluson (1179-1241) was the son of an upstart Icelandic chieftain. He rose to become Iceland's richest and, for a time, most powerful leader. Jesse Byock is a professor of Icelandic and Old Norse studies at UCLA. He is the translator of *The Saga of the Volsungs* and *The Saga of King Hrolf Kraki* for Penguin Classics.

It was a little shorter than I had hoped. All in all, this is a wonderfully crafted collection of Norse

history. The prose is easy to follow, and the stories are second to none. I would definitely recommend this book to others.

This book now holds a very dear place in my bookshelf. The Edda is a great insight into the tales of the Norse gods and anyone wishing to know more about these great adventurous people and their pagan rituals would do well to pick up this translation and give it a read. Aside from actual tales, there are many footnotes placed by Byock that offer further detail into the occurrences of the tales and even some historical context on which to cement some characters or occurrences mentioned in the stories. Byock's translation was a very pleasing read and I recommend this book to anyone who has a hunger for Norse lore.

It's a little more difficult read than The Poetic Edda.

As a descendant of Shetlanders, it is very interesting to read about the ancient beliefs of my forefathers. The introduction by Sturluson is especially interesting because he was a Christian writing about pagan beliefs and explains his (and my own) reasons for studying these things. This small book is written in a very enjoyable and easy to read style. I received great service, as well.
