

A shack of a house that is currently being converted by the new guy in town. No one knows much about Vance Banning, but it is rumored that he is an out of work carpenter. After a brief introduction Vance is rude and stand offish to Shane. They come to a truce of sorts and Shane offers him a job working on the repairs on her house. He accepts. The thing is he is not quite an unemployed carpenter. This book is entertaining. But for me it showed it's age a bit, it was written in 1984. Nora has definitely written a lot better stories. It has some funny moments. And some cheesy ones. If you are a die hard Nora fan, of course you have to buy it and read it at least once. Otherwise I recommend reading a friend's copy or visiting your local library.
